

## **How to post on the National Policy Forum website:**

go to <https://www.policyforum.labour.org.uk/> and sign in as you would to the main Labour website.

Hover over the grey bar 'Get Involved' and click on 'make a submission'  
Then click on the green tab 'make a submission' and scroll down to see the pre-printed form.

There is a box for a title and a drop-down list of Commissions.  
The old ones were called:

### **International**

The International Policy Commission develops Labour's international policy. It is responsible for foreign policy, international development and defence.

### **Work, Pensions and Equality**

The Work, Pensions and Equality Policy Commission is charged with developing Labour's policy on social security, poverty and equalities.

### **Environment, Energy and Culture**

The Environment, Energy and Culture Policy Commission is tasked with leading Labour's policy development on the environment, food and rural affairs, energy and climate change, and culture, media and sport.

### **Health and Social Care**

The Health and Social Care Policy Commission develops Labour policy and thinking on areas including the future of the NHS, mental health, public health and social care.

### **Early Years, Education and Skills**

The Early Years, Education and Skills Policy Commission looks at issues relating to children's wellbeing, development and care, as well as education training and skills from childhood through adulthood.

### **Justice and Home Affairs**

•The Justice and Home Affairs Policy Commission examines Labour thinking on issues such as policing, the justice system, immigration and asylum, political and constitutional reform and Brexit.

### **Housing, Local Government and Transport**

The Housing, Local Government and Transport Policy Commission develops Labour policy concerning local government and devolution, housebuilding and the housing sector, and Britain's transport infrastructure and services.

### **Economy, Business and Trade**

The Economy, Business and Trade Policy Commission develops Labour's economic and business policy, including industrial strategy and international trade

but when the consultations start on 27<sup>th</sup> May they should be:

- **A green and digital future:** covering climate and net zero, energy, the environment, food, rural affairs, and science and digital technology, transport (related to decarbonisation)
- **Better jobs and better work:** covering tax, the economy, employment rights, the future of work, business, skills and industrial strategy, vocational education, procurement, insourcing, reshoring
- **Safe and secure communities:** covering police and crime, the criminal justice system, prisons and probation, online safety, local government, planning, high streets, retail, the Constitution and civil rights, transport (local and related to connectivity)

- **Public services that work from the start:** covering the NHS, healthcare, social care, mental health, education and youth services, schools, colleges and universities
- **A future where families come first:** covering social security, pensions, childcare, early years, housing and homelessness, women and equalities, and culture
- **Britain in the world:** covering defence, foreign affairs, international development, trade, illicit finance

Cut and paste your submission (from an open text word document). The box will hold 600 words; and more you can attach as a pdf.
